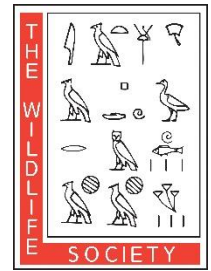


**North Central Section Student Conclave

It's that time of year again! The Purdue University Student TWS Chapter invites you to attend the 2017 North Central Section Student Conclave. This event will take place on Friday, March 24th - Sunday, March 26th at Camp Tecumseh in Brookston, Indiana. This is a great opportunity to meet students from other chapters, gain or improve field skills, and network with professionals.

Camp Tecumseh

Camp Tecumseh is a summer camp location owned by the YMCA that provides outdoor activities and accommodations for meetings and conferences and is located just outside of Lafayette, Indiana along the Tippecanoe River. Students will stay in cabins furnished with 14 beds apiece and 2-3 toilets/showers per cabin. Each cabin is within walking distance of meeting spaces, the dining hall, and program areas. Meals will include Friday dinner, Saturday breakfast, lunch, and dinner, and Sunday breakfast. Camp Tecumseh is an alcohol-free facility.

Packing List: Sleeping bag, pillow, toiletry items, towel/washcloth, muck/rubber boots, binoculars (optional), flashlight or headlamp, and money/check for the silent auction.

Waders are an optional packing item since we will have herping events in the evening in a small pond at the site. Herping can be done with muck boots, but more will be gained from it if you bring waders. In addition, members of the wildlife olympics team should have waders for specific stations.

Conclave is the end of March when weather in Indiana is unpredictable; bring appropriate gear since many activities will take place outdoors. Camp Tecumseh is also located on Tippecanoe River and the terrain can vary throughout the property. The camp has many trails that run through the forest, near the river, and a small pond – make sure to take advantage of the trails and beautiful site during our free time on Saturday!

Tentative Activities

Paracord Bracelets: Make your own paracord survival bracelet after checking in!

Resume Workshop: Receive tips on how to format a resume, wording, what to include, how to tailor it to certain jobs and how to have your resume stand out overall. Please bring a copy of your latest resume.

Graduate Student Panel: Bring your questions about grad school and here from those who have already been through the process of applying!

Evening Herping: Late March in Indiana is a great time to observe frog calls and breeding behavior, and the emergence of reptiles and amphibians after the winter weather – join us in the evenings for some herping!

Conservation Officer and K-9 Demo: Hear from an Indiana CO and his K-9 “Drake” and how they help with wildlife conservation and forensics on a daily basis.

Wildlife Olympics: Test your wildlife knowledge through a variety of stations covering topics from trapping techniques to identification to forestry to navigation.

Telemetry “Tag”: Spend some time learning telemetry techniques then participate in a competition for the most collars!

Bird Banding: Participate in our “bonus” event before breakfast – banding birds with those who know how to do it best and get real experience handling birds.

Silent Auction: Check out cool items such as field guides, clothing, outdoor equipment, and other related items that were donated to our student chapter. **Bring money if you wish to participate!**

Photo Contest

Share your amazing photos with students of the North Central Section! Photos will be on display for the duration of conclave with awards being presented Saturday evening before Quiz Bowl. The entry fee is \$1 per photograph. Each conclave attendee may submit one (1) photo in each of the five categories: **Fauna, Flora, Landscape/ Scenic, Human Dimensions** (ex. Hunting, Hiking, Wildlife Education programs, etc.) **and Cell Phone** (Natural resource related images taken on a cell phone). All photos must be taken by the individual submitting the photographs. Photos must be matted (white or black preferred) but not framed and must be 8x10 inches in size. Prizes will be awarded for 1st place within each category, People's Choice and a Best in Show overall. Voting for People's choice will occur throughout the day on Saturday. Photographs submitted at previous Conclaves are not eligible. Photos must be submitted electronically by March 18th, 2016 to Luke Voorhees (lvoorhee@purdue.edu) and a hard copy submitted at registration on Friday. Photos may be picked up before you depart Sunday morning.

Photo Contest Rules

- Photos must be in matting (black or white preferred, no cardboard).
- Photos must be 8 X 10 inches in size.
- There is a \$1 fee per photo entry.
- Each conclave participant is allowed to enter 1 photo per category, for a total of up to 5 photos.
- Photos will be judged by a panel of two photography judges (TBD) except for the People's Choice award, which will be a voting by conclave attendees.
- Prizes will be awarded for first place in each category, people's choice and best in show.
- Must be present to win.
- Photos must be submitted electronically by March 18th, 2017 to lvoorhee@purdue.edu and a hard copy when you register.
- Photos and payment must be turned in at check-in and photos will be available for pick up on Sunday at breakfast.

Club Activity Poster Session

Club posters are a great way to show off what your chapter has been doing in the past year! Posters may include but are not limited to chapter events, research, projects, achievements, number of members, PICTURES and more. Posters can be handmade or printed from the computer but a try-fold cardboard style is preferred as to leave more room to hang research posters. Posters will be turned in at the registration table on Friday and displayed for the duration of conclave. Posters may be picked up upon departure on Sunday.

Research Poster Session

Bring a poster and share what research you have been doing! All abstracts must be under 300 words, and should include a statement of objectives, and a brief description of methods, results, and conclusion. Scientific names should be included in the abstract but not in the paper/poster titles. All categories/fields of study will be considered. To make a submission request, please email Liz Brewer at brewer52@purdue.edu by March 4th with an attached document containing poster title, abstract, and author names.

All abstracts will have a blind review by conclave planning committee members. Due to space and time restraints, we may not be able to accept all submission but we will do our best to accommodate as much as possible. A notice of decision will be sent to you via email by March 11th which will include further information such as size limit of posters. All Research posters will be checked in on Friday at the Registration/Check in table and can be picked up before you depart from conclave on Sunday. Judges for posters are still to be determined. There will be a prize for the first place poster. Questions can be referred to Liz Brewer (brewer52@purdue.edu).

Quiz Bowl

Test your expertise in wildlife trivia at the 2017 TWS Student Conclave Quiz Bowl Competition! Teams of 5 members (4 competitors and 1 alternate) from each college/university will battle head to head in a fun and competitive event to see which school possesses the greatest wildlife trivia knowledge. Rules will be similar to the guidelines used at the annual

national conference and can be found at <http://www.twsconference.org/quiz-bowl/>. However, we will be doing 7.5 minute matches with a 10-minute final match in order to end at a reasonable time. Participation is limited to undergraduate students. If your school would like to participate, please note that in the sign-up sheet at the end of this packet.

Directions to Camp Tecumseh

From the North/Northwest

Take Interstate 65 to the Brookston exit east (# 188) which is State Road 18 (left turn off the exit ramp). In Brookston, you jog right and then left at the light to stay on State Road 18. Then go five miles East of Brookston on State Road 18, until you come to an intersection with flashing lights and a green highway sign that says "Camp Tecumseh/Springboro." Turn left up a steep winding hill. Go 9/10ths of a mile to a large Camp Tecumseh sign (Tecumseh Bend Road) and turn right. (Before you turn you will see a large barn and pastureland on right).

From the South/Southwest

Take Interstate 65 to the West Lafayette/Brookston exit, (#178) which is State Road 43 North. Turn right off of exit ramp. Take State Road 43 North to Brookston and turn right (east) on to State Road 18. Then go five miles East of Brookston on State Road 18 until you come to an intersection with flashing lights and a green highway sign that says "Camp Tecumseh/Springboro." Turn left up a steep winding hill. Go 9/10ths of a mile to a large Camp Tecumseh sign (Tecumseh Bend Road) and turn right.

From the East

Go to Delphi, which is on State Road 25 and State Road 18. Follow State Road 18 west (for a short stretch this is also State Road 421 coming out of Delphi). Follow State Road 18 over the Tippecanoe River. Just after the bridge, until you come to an intersection with flashing lights and a green highway sign that says "Camp Tecumseh/Springboro." Turn right up a steep winding hill. Go 9/10ths of a mile to a large Camp Tecumseh sign (Tecumseh Bend Road) and turn right.

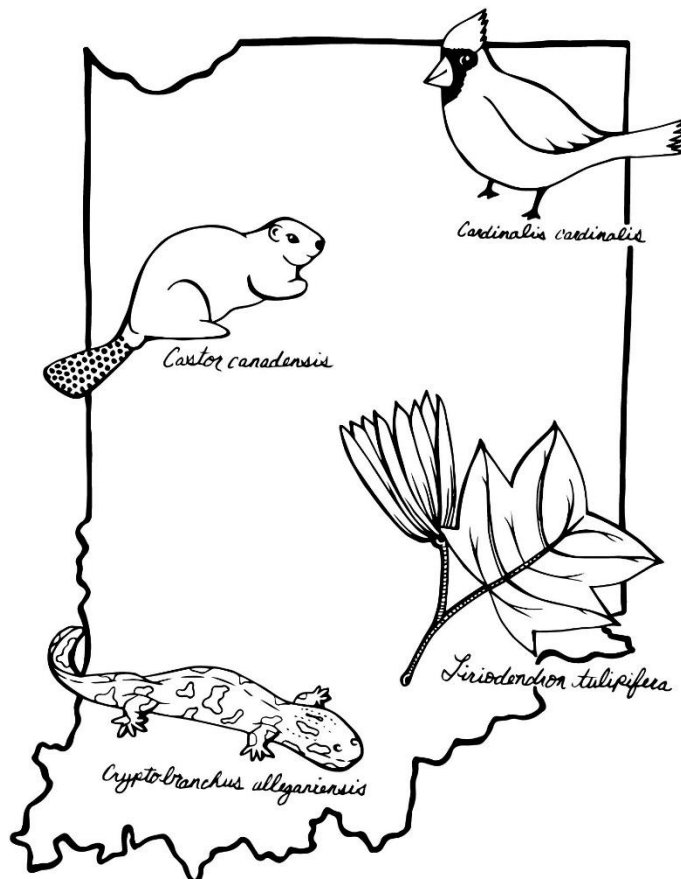
