1	At the end of subtitle E of title IV, add the following:
2	SEC. 44 WILD HORSES IN AND AROUND THE
3	CURRITUCK NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE.
4	(a) AGREEMENT REQUIRED.—
5	(1) In general.—Not later than 180 days
6	after the date of enactment of this Act, the Sec-
7	retary of the Interior (referred to in this section as
8	the "Secretary") shall enter into an agreement with
9	the Corolla Wild Horse Fund (a nonprofit corpora-
10	tion established under the laws of the State of North

1	Carolina), the County of Currituck, North Carolina
2	and the State of North Carolina to provide for man-
3	agement of free-roaming wild horses in and around
4	the Currituck National Wildlife Refuge.
5	(2) Terms.—The agreement shall—
6	(A) allow a herd of not fewer than 110 and
7	not more than 130 free-roaming wild horses in
8	and around the refuge, with a target population
9	of between 120 and 130 free-roaming wild
10	horses;
11	(B) provide for cost-effective management
12	of the horses while ensuring that natural re-
13	sources within the refuge are not adversely im-
14	pacted;
15	(C) provide for introduction of a small
16	number of free-roaming wild horses from the
17	herd at Cape Lookout National Seashore as is
18	necessary to maintain the genetic viability of
19	the herd in and around the Currituck National
20	Wildlife Refuge; and
21	(D) specify that the Corolla Wild Horse
22	Fund shall pay the costs associated with—
23	(i) coordinating a periodic census and
24	inspecting the health of the horses;

1	(ii) maintaining records of the horses
2	living in the wild and in confinement;
3	(iii) coordinating the removal and
4	placement of horses and monitoring of any
5	horses removed from the Currituck County
6	Outer Banks; and
7	(iv) administering a viable population
8	control plan for the horses, including auc-
9	tions, adoptions, contraceptive fertility
10	methods, and other viable options.
11	(b) Conditions for Excluding Wild Horses
12	FROM REFUGE.—The Secretary shall not exclude free-
13	roaming wild horses from any portion of the Currituck
14	National Wildlife Refuge unless—
15	(1) the Secretary finds that the presence of
16	free-roaming wild horses on a portion of that refuge
17	threatens the survival of an endangered species for
18	which that land is designated as critical habitat
19	under the Endangered Species Act of 1973 (16
20	U.S.C. 1531 et seq.);
21	(2) the finding is based on a credible peer-re-
22	viewed scientific assessment; and
23	(3) the Secretary provides a period of public no-
24	tice and comment on that finding.

1	(c) Requirements for Introduction of Horses
2	From Cape Lookout National Seashore.—During
3	the effective period of the memorandum of understanding
4	between the National Park Service and the Foundation
5	for Shackleford Horses, Inc. (a non-profit corporation or-
6	ganized under the laws of and doing business in the State
7	of North Carolina) signed in 2007, no horse may be re-
8	moved from Cape Lookout National Seashore for intro-
9	duction at Currituck National Wildlife Refuge except—
10	(1) with the approval of the Foundation; and
11	(2) consistent with the terms of the memo-
12	randum (or any successor agreement) and the Man-
13	agement Plan for the Shackleford Banks Horse
14	Herd signed in January 2006 (or any successor
15	management plan).
16	(d) No Liability Created.—Nothing in this sec-
17	tion creates liability for the United States for any damage
18	caused by the free-roaming wild horses to any person or
19	property located inside or outside the boundaries of the
20	Currituck National Wildlife Refuge.
