This training will focus on identifying Blanding's turtle habitat using the criteria and techniques in the Grgurovic protocols for *the Blanding's Turtle (Emydoidea blandingii)*. Attendees will gain knowledge of Blanding's turtle life history, habitat, and state requirements. This will provide *introductory* experience in identifying Blanding's turtle habitat.
