The Virginia Chapter, The Wildlife Society, will award a \$500 scholarship to a junior or senior enrolled at a Virginia college or university during 2019-2020. The purpose of the scholarship is to reward a student who has the potential to make significant contributions to the field of wildlife management. The scholarship will be awarded at the annual meeting of the Virginia Chapter on February 6, 2020. Recipients will be expected to attend to receive their award.

The Virginia Chapter seeks to develop and promote sound stewardship of wildlife resources and the environments upon which wildlife and humans depend. The membership includes wildlife professionals who include research scientists, educators, resource managers, conservation law enforcement officers, administrators and information specialists.

Eligible students must be majoring in a natural resources program that may include wildlife, outdoor recreation, environmental studies, biology, forestry or a related field. Additional award criteria are: scholarship, leadership qualities, good character, participation in extracurricular activities, potential and interest to contribute to the field of wildlife management, merit, and membership in The Wildlife Society (any level) or a similar campus club.
