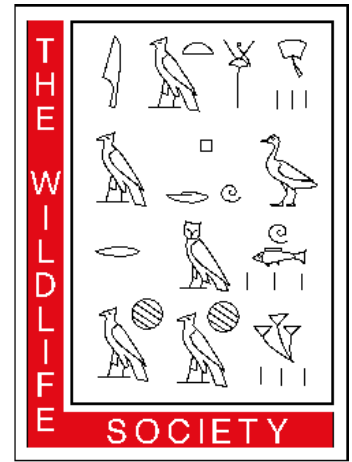

Data Exploration to Avoid Common Statistical Problem: Parts 1 & 2

Trained wildlife professionals are often expected to have basic data collection and analysis capabilities. Alain Zuur and colleagues (2010) offered a step-by-step procedure for data exploration that ultimately aids in statistical analyses. Here, I offer a workshop based on the Zuur et.al. publication.
