Dear Chairman Simpson and Ranking Member Pingree,

The undersigned organizations respectfully request the U.S. House of Representatives Appropriations Subcommittee on Interior, Environment, and Related Agencies include a provision in a Fiscal Year 2024 appropriations package that recognizes the importance of professional societies to the Federal workforce.

Congress should encourage federal agencies to recognize the valuable role professional societies hold in assuring sound scientific management principles are applied to resources management through strengthening competencies of the federal workforce.
