- 4) a) **If you have an accepted abstract** (you do not need to be lead author)
 - i. Your abstract (Title, Authors, Full

Abstract)

- ii. Presentation type (oral or poster)
- iii. Presentation Category
- b) **If you do not have an accepted abstract** describe why attendance would be valuable in advancing your education/career goals (250 word maximum).
- 5) A brief (400 word maximum) essay on your background (professional/educational), interests, current work/research, relevant contributions (to education, science, community, TWS), future goals, and the overall relevance of your research/work to the mission of the HRWG (<u>Habitat Restoration Working Group</u> The Wildlife Society).

To reflect that support applicants are encouraged to disclose personal or professional experiences that reflect their shared support or identity within any marginalized group(s).
