CALL FOR PRESENTATIONS AND POSTERS

Student Presentation Session

Undergraduate and graduate students involved in wildlife research are invited to present their work during the Student Presentation Session, which will take place 1-5 PM on Wednesday, March 5, 2025. Student presentation time slots will be 15 minutes each, with 12 minutes for the presentation and 3 minutes for questions. An award for the Best Student Presentation will be given on Thursday (6 March) during the banquet.

Professional Presentation Session

Professionals involved in wildlife research or management are invited to present their activities during our Professional Presentation Session, which will take place 9 AM-12 PM and 3-4:30 PM on Thursday, March 6, 2025. Our theme this year is **Changing Technology and Landscapes in Wildlife Management**. Professional presentation time slots can vary in length but generally are 30 minutes long, with 20-25 minutes for each presentation and 5-10 minutes for questions.

Poster Session

Wildlife students and professionals are encouraged to present research or other activities in a poster format (maximum 40 x 40 inches) during the Poster Session, which will take place 4:30-5:30 PM on Thursday, March 6, 2025. An award for the Best Student Poster will be given at the evening banquet this same day.

Presentation and Poster Abstract Submission

Please submit abstracts (300 word limit) for these sessions to Lindsey Phillips and Barbara Shock at lphill46@vols.utk.edu and barbara.shock@lmunet.edu by 15 January 2025. Abstracts should be submitted as e-mail attachments in MS Word (Times New Roman font and font size 12) and should include the following information:

- 1) Title of presentation or poster
- 2) Authors and affiliations (use an asterisk to indicate the author making the presentation, and include contact information for the contact person)
- 3) Intended session (Student Presentation, Professional Presentation, or Poster)
