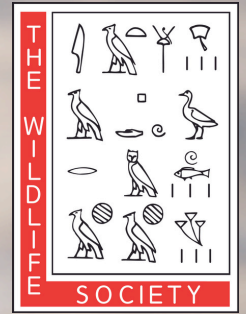


POLICY PRIORITIES

Investments in conservation benefit wildlife and people, but federal funding for wildlife conservation continues to decline. TWS is working towards a future where conservation programs have the resources they need to improve the status of wildlife populations.

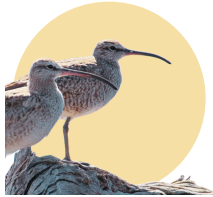
Areas of focus: Recovering America's Wildlife Act – National Wildlife Refuge System – USGS Ecosystems Mission Area – State and Tribal Wildlife Grants – Farm Bill



Conservation of biological diversity

Threats to biodiversity are substantial and increasing. We need proactive policies that promote a world where wildlife and people thrive in resilient ecosystems.

Areas of focus: Endangered Species Act – Wildlife Movement Through Partnership Act – Wildlife Crossing Pilot Program – North American Grasslands Conservation Act – Migratory Bird Treaty Act



Science as the foundation of wildlife policy

Conservation policy decisions must be based in research, data, and best available knowledge. We advocate for the appropriate use of science and traditional ecological knowledge in decision making processes and work to connect policymakers with the expertise of TWS members.
